WHEN TO GO

MAY - AUG

- Iconic Arctic wildlife, fjords, mountains and glaciers
- Explore Spitsbergen by ship, Zodiac, kayak and on foot
- See how people live in the world's northernmost settlement, Longyearbyen
- Expect amazing photography as the summer light illuminates the full spectrum of fjords, glaciers, towering cliffs and ice-laden waterways.

WHAT TO EXPECT

- The diminished seasonal ice in late August and September makes it easier to reach remote destinations on Baffin Island
- Visit Pangnirtung to meet Inuit artists and purchase unique art
- Retrace the route of the historic 1840s Franklin expedition along the historic Northwest Passage
- Watch for iconic wildlife on Zodiac cruises in fjords throughout the Canadian High Arctic
- Visit the famous fossil forest at Axel Heiberg,
 Canada's second-most northerly island.

- Late season in Greenland is the best time to see the Northern Lights since more darkness improves visibility
- Experience Ilulissat Icefjord, a tidal fjord and UNESCO World Heritage site
- Visit modern Greenlandic communities and meet locals
- Explore Viking and Norse history, as well as 14th-century ruins at Hvalsey Church
- Join helicopter-supported adventures along the Tasermiut Fjord (available on *Ultramarine* only).

WHAT TO SEE

- Watch for polar bears as they hunt for food along the ice edge
- Surfacing whales, sunbathing walruses and roaming reindeer are frequently spotted
- Expect exceptional bird-watching at the massive Alkefiellet cliffs, which are the breeding grounds for 30 different types of seabirds.
- Hiking and kayaking provide incredible views of Arctic wildlife by land or sea
- Wildlife-viewing includes polar bears, muskoxen, beluga whales and walruses
- See reminders of the early days of Arctic exploration at Beechey Island and other national historic sites.
- Muskoxen wander throughout the land, grazing in herds
- Hiking provides an opportunity to explore the remote fjord-strewn coastal areas of Greenland
- See the massive Greenland Ice Sheet while on a heli flightseeing tour (available on *Ultramarine* only).
